Making the arrangements for a Funeral Service is one of the most personal matters that you will be responsible for. As many decisions will need to be made over the arrangements for the service, we will support and guide you through these many decisions by offering advice and suggestion.

We will liaise with the local crematoria, cemeteries and clergy on your behalf in order to ensure that all relevant legal paperwork has been completed in order to allow the service to be carried out.

All of our arrangements will be confirmed in writing prior to the Funeral Service taking place. In regard to financial matters, we will provide a written estimate in all cases.

We will of course, respect the decisions made by each and every family and carry out the Funeral Service to the highest standard.

When a Death Occurs at home

It is more than likely that you will have been in contact with the Doctor prior to your loved one passing away. When you believe that death has occurred, you will need to call the doctor who may attend and confirm that this has happened.

The Doctor will then issue a death certificate, although this may take a few days, and you will usually need to collect this from the surgery.

It is important that the family are given enough time to spend time with your loved one prior to ourselves taking them into our care and returning them to our private Chapel of Rest.

When a death occurs at a nursing or residential home

It is likely that the death will have been confirmed by the Manager or Matron of the home.

Again, it is important to ensure that you are given time to spend with your loved one prior to them being taken into our care. You will need to advise the matron or the manager of the home as to when you are ready for us to take your loved one into our care.

The Matron or Manager will be able to advise you on contacting the doctor to arrange for the death certificate to be collected, as it is likely that a duty doctor will have attended as opposed to the Deceased's GP.

When a death occurs in a General Hospital

Following a death in a general hospital, you will need to make an appointment at the Patient affairs office or bereavement office to collect the death certificate and any personal effects that the deceased may have had with them

In all the above cases, your final responsibility will be to register the death.

Registration

Each and every Death in England and Wales must be registered.

Following a death, the person responsible for making the arrangements for the funeral service must arrange to collect the death certificate from the doctor who certificated that death has occurred.

The death certificate must then be taken to the local registrar. Generally, you will need to make an appointment to register the death.

The registrar will need to know the following information,

- The full name of the deceased,
- The date and place of death,
- The deceased's home address,
- The deceased's maiden name if necessary,
- The deceased's date and place of birth,
- The deceased's former occupation if necessary,
- Full details of the person registering the death.

The registrar will issue a number of documents. These may include certificates that will allow the funeral service to proceed and those that will allow you to close bank accounts and claim on insurance policies.

Both ourselves and the registrar will explain what the certificates are for.

The Coroner

When a death occurs suddenly, the Coroner may be involved. The action taken by the Coroner and the associated paperwork varies. As such, we would provide advice based on each individual families situation.
